Our sovereign God, who entrusted Josephine and I with this ministry 16 years ago, has been faithful to provide for all our needs. For us at NLF, it has been 16 years of seeing God's favour, experiencing his faithfulness, the power of his transformation, miraculous provision, divine connections and above all seeing God rescue, change and save lives of children and other members of the NLF community. None of this could be truly fulfilled if it wasn't for God's hand through donors and sponsors from around the world. In this newsletter, we share with you some of the testimonies of God's faithfulness to us.

In April 2018, God enabled me to visit USA and share His Word and wonderful testimonies about what He is doing here at NLF Tanzania.

I visited Reach Church in Austin Texas. This church funded the purchase of our school bus.



To God's glory, this time, Reach church raised \$8,000 to support our building project at NLF. God's hand didn't stop there. The church pledged to raise an additional US\$50,000 in the future so we can complete the payment for the entire 1st floor of the new building. In addition to that, Reach church purchased 15 new laptop computers for a school computer laboratory. This will enable us to offer a digital boot camp course for Form Four leavers. Our children will be forever changed by this new addition to their lives.



During my visit to Promise church in New York, a potential partnership was born and we are now looking into creating a Promise Church sponsorship package.

I also saw the hand of God during my visit at Madison Christian School in Ohio. The school offered to donate their former science curriculum materials to NLF. Also because of their participation in the Association of Christian Schools International –ACSI, there could be support for us in educational materials. We are looking forward to exploring further partnerships with Madison Christian School and possible short–term mission trips to NLF in 2020.

Lastly, on this visit the University of North America from Washington DC informed me of the decision to award Josephine and I a Global Leadership Award. In June I returned to USA and was so grateful to receive this award. We feel we do not deserve such an honour, however God has done it in His own way and fashion.

Our hearts are filled with gratitude towards Reach Church, Promise Church, Madison Christian School and everyone I met. God is using you to enable the children at NLF to break away from the cycle of poverty and reach their God given potential for the glory of God.

We are filled with praise of the faithfulness of our good, good Father God. Our hearts cannot contain all that he is doing and all that he is yet to do through you. May His name be praised!

When I came I didn't know how to write the letter 'y' in my name, I only knew how to count numbers and some ABCD.

Now I love to study mathematics, I'm understanding well, even science

I'm understanding and English writing and reading. I am thanking God I know Him because I didn't know Him before. That's why I love this school so much I know how to pray and to know God, I'm so thankful.

In the future....

When I grow up I will find the work I will do, even to be a Grade two teacher. I would like to help people who don't have a house. I will build even two houses, one for them and one for me.

Being sponsored...

I was asking why don't I have a sponsor and other people have a sponsor so I prayed and prayed, I even said can I get two sponsors...and I did. They carry me well in their heart because they pray for me, and every day I pray for them, I pray for their exams too.
